

Geriatric Clinician Educators

UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH

We are seeking fellowship-trained clinician educators for our expanding Geriatrics Division at the University of Pittsburgh.

Designated by the John A. Hartford Foundation as a National Center of Excellence, the University of Pittsburgh has one of the nation's largest geriatrics divisions, with more than two dozen geriatricians who practice with more than a dozen geriatric psychiatrists. The University is ranked among the nation's top 10 in NIH funding, while its health system is ranked in the nation's topmost clinical tier by *US News and World Report* and the Division is ranked 8th in Geriatrics. In addition, within the last year Pittsburgh has been named Best Arts City, Most Liveable City, and Best Urban Adventure City and remains one of America's most affordable and best places to live.

Geriatricians work in the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC)—a large health system that provides opportunities for geriatricians with interests in acute care medicine (hospitalists), outpatient practice (consults, primary care) and community based long term care. For geriatrician-hospitalists there are new programs in geriatric consultation and hospital medicine that afford a unique and exciting opportunity for career development as a clinician and medical leader. In ambulatory care the Benedum Geriatric Center and Senior Care are renowned for their excellence and are evolving Medicare medical homes. The program includes PACE sites, home care, skilled nursing facilities and CCRC's that are integrated into the UPMC continuum of Geriatric care.

Ample educational opportunities are available as well, since the division provides geriatric education to trainees at all levels, including teaching in all four years of the medical school, required rotations for residents in internal medicine and other disciplines, and a fellowship program in geriatric medicine. Opportunities abound for clinician-educators to collaborate on research projects and numerous quality improvement and patient safety initiatives. The clinician-educator will join colleagues in the Division who have a passion for patient care, quality improvement and scholarly activity.
