

~ Osteoporosis Research Study ~



Are you a postmenopausal woman 45-89 years of age?

Do you have osteoporosis or low bone mass?

If so, you could be eligible to participate in a research study.

The Osteoporosis Prevention and Treatment Center at the University of Pittsburgh is conducting a one-year study to learn whether an investigational drug called zoledronic acid, when given together with teriparatide (Forteo/Forteo®), will treat osteoporosis better than teriparatide alone. Zoledronic acid is not FDA approved for the treatment of osteoporosis, although it is FDA approved for complications (such as high blood calcium, pain and fractures) in cancer patients. Teriparatide is FDA approved for the treatment of osteoporosis in women who are at high risk for fracture

This one-year study involves 9 clinic visits. Parking vouchers provided. You will receive a \$20 gift certificate for each completed study visit.
